### Biography

Kalina Duncan, DrPH, MPH currently serves as the Branch Chief of the Partnerships and Dissemination Branch at the US National Cancer Institute (NCI) Center for Global Health (CGH). She has been at CGH since 2013 in Public Health Analyst and Team Lead positions, leading work in data analysis, evaluation, and program implementation.

Prior to her time at CGH, Kalina worked at the Tobacco Control Research Branch at the US NCI, the Office of International Health and Biodefense in the Bureau of Oceans and International Environmental and Scientific Affairs at the U.S. Department of State, and the Fogarty International Center as a Presidential Management Fellow.

Kalina has extensive experience building partnerships with Ministries of Health and cancer research and control organizations in low- and middle-income countries to develop, cost, and implement cancer control plans and strengthen cancer and risk factor surveillance and research. Kalina has a Doctorate of Public Health from the Gillings School of Global Public Health at University of North Carolina. Her dissertation research was focused on strengthening health systems and cervical cancer prevention programs in Zambia.
