

Please find below a curated selection of activities and places of interest recommended by **the Hong Kong Tourism Board**, with practical information and links for further details.

### Victoria Harbour and Star Ferry

Step aboard the [Star Ferry](#) for a simple, memorable crossing and a front-row view of Hong Kong's celebrated skyline. For a longer experience, take the approximately one-hour [Star Ferry Harbour Tour at night](#) or explore the waterfront and viewing points around [Victoria Harbour](#).

### Night markets

Explore streets filled with colourful signs, cultural landmarks and the aromas of food stalls. Start with [Temple Street Night Market](#), where stalls, local dishes and street performances create a lively evening atmosphere, or browse this guide to [Hong Kong's street markets](#).

### Restaurants, bars and nightlife

Hong Kong has a range of restaurants, bars and entertainment districts. Hong Kong is home to venues recognised by Asia's 50 Best Bars and The World's 50 Best Bars, alongside relaxed neighbourhood spots and lively entertainment districts.

### Mid-Autumn Lantern Carnival

The Mid-Autumn Lantern Carnival takes place at Victoria Park from 17 to 27 September. It includes lantern displays, traditional arts and crafts, and elements of Hong Kong's intangible cultural heritage. Admission is free. Lanterns are illuminated from 18:30 to 23:00, and until midnight on 25 September.

### Victoria Peak and Peak Circle Walk

Head towards Victoria Peak for a sweeping perspective over the harbour, towers and surrounding hills. Ride the historic [Peak Tram](#), then follow the easy, 3.5-kilometre [Peak Circle Walk](#), which takes around an hour and includes panoramic viewpoints along Lugard Road.

### Hong Kong Tramways

Board one of the city's historic double-decker trams and watch neighbourhoods unfold at street level. Use the Hong Kong Tourism Board's guide to the [beloved "ding ding" and three suggested routes](#), or take the one-hour [TramOramic sightseeing tour](#) aboard a 1920s-style tram.

### Neighbourhoods and guided tours

Slow the pace in streets where traditional businesses, cafés, markets and contemporary creative spaces sit side by side. Explore independently with the Tourism Board's [Sham Shui Po neighbourhood guide](#), or join a guided experience such as [The Hidden Treasures of Central and Sheung Wan](#), the [Central and Sheung Wan Foodie Tour](#) or the [Sham Shui Po Foodie Tour](#).

### Ngong Ping 360 Cable Car

Travel across Lantau Island on the [Ngong Ping 360 cable car](#), a 5.7-kilometre journey from Tung Chung to Ngong Ping Village that takes around 25 minutes. Along the way, enjoy panoramic views over Lantau's mountains and valleys, Hong Kong International Airport and the Hong Kong–Zhuhai–Macao Bridge.

At the top, explore Ngong Ping Village and continue to nearby attractions such as the [Tian Tan Buddha](#) and [Po Lin Monastery](#).

### Hike between skyline and sea

Choose a trail that opens onto mountain, harbour or coastal views. Browse the Hong Kong Tourism Board's [Great Outdoors guide](#) for routes to suit different experience levels, or consider the guided, moderate [Peak to South Hiking Tour](#), which connects city views, country parks and Aberdeen.

## Visit museums, galleries and cultural venues

Choose a venue to match your interests:

- **M+** — explore contemporary visual art, design, architecture and moving image in the West Kowloon Cultural District.
- **Hong Kong Palace Museum** — discover Chinese art and culture through treasures from the Palace Museum and special exhibitions from leading international institutions.
- **Hong Kong Museum of Art** — see Chinese antiquities, painting and calligraphy, China Trade art, and modern and Hong Kong art beside Victoria Harbour in Tsim Sha Tsui.
- **Hong Kong Museum of History** — trace the city's development and changing communities through extensive historical exhibits.
- **Hong Kong Heritage Museum** — explore Hong Kong popular culture, Cantonese opera, Chinese art and rotating design and heritage exhibitions in Sha Tin.
- **Tai Kwun** — combine heritage buildings, contemporary art, exhibitions and performing arts at the former Central Police Station compound.
- **Xiqu Centre** — experience Cantonese opera and other forms of traditional Chinese theatre, including performances in an intimate tea-house setting.
- **PMQ** — browse studios and shops by Hong Kong designers, join creative workshops and explore the history of this revitalised former police residential complex.
